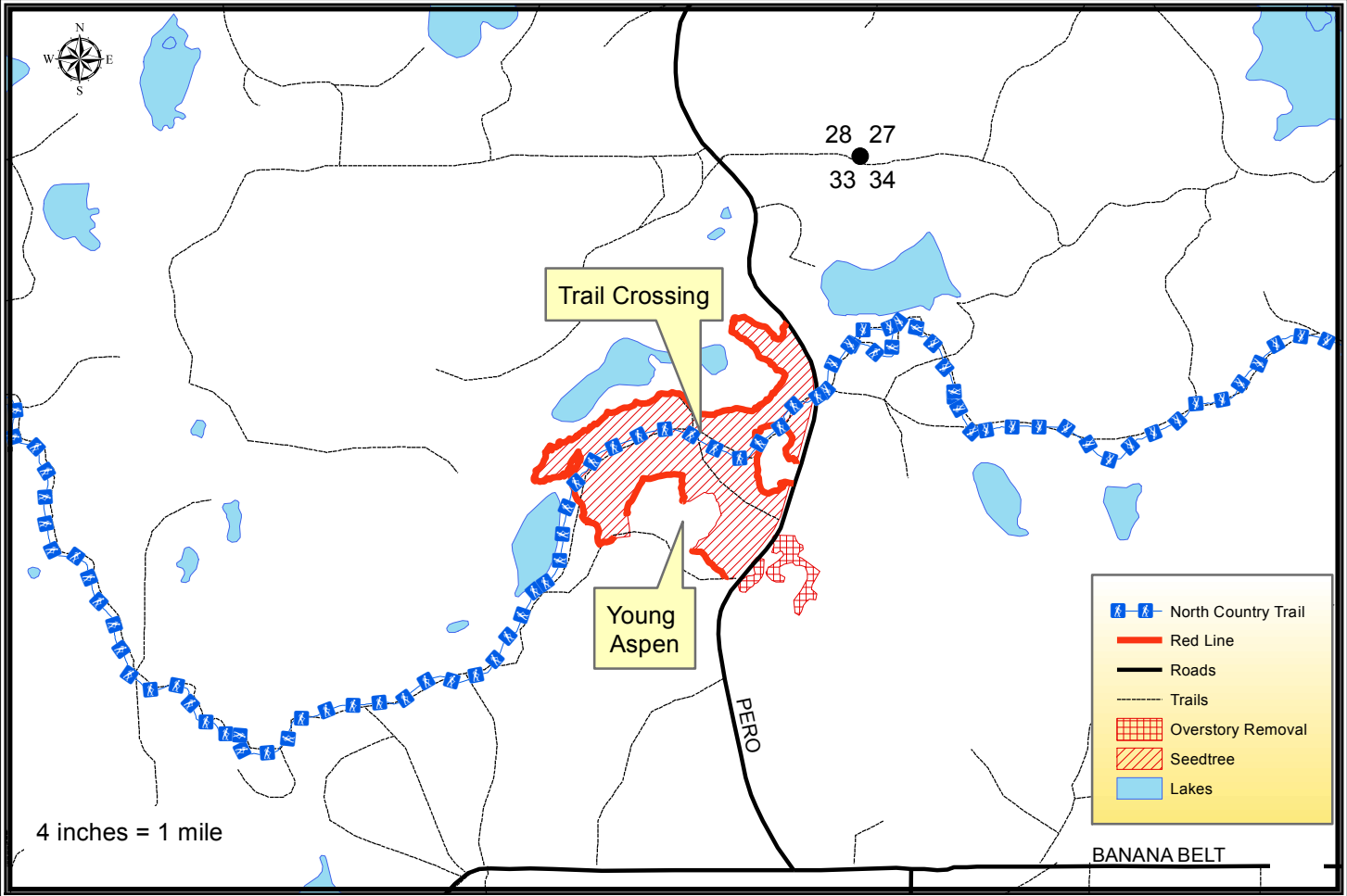

- Harvest Requirements:**
- Sale is an oak seedtree and an overstory removal being sold on a Ticket Scale Basis
 - Seedtree: Sale boundaries consist of red paint line, roads, and abrupt timber type changes to young aspen.
 - Overstory Removal: Sale boundaries are not marked with red line but a provided GPS file, or GPS unit if requested, will be provided to assist with staying inside of the timber sale area.
 - Seedtree: Harvest all unmarked hardwood stems 2 inches in diameter and greater. Leave all red pine, white pine, stems marked with blue blazes and hardwood stems marked with purple paint. Leave trees next to the trail are only marked on the side facing away from the trail.
 - Overstory Removal: Harvest all Aspen 8 inches in diameter and greater.
 - The North Country Trail (NCT) runs through the seedtree sale area-blazed with blue. No cutting of blue-blazed trees. The NCT should be kept in good condition at all times. Maintain a slash-free zone within 25' of the NCT. No hauling, landing or decking wood on the NCT. The NCT may only be skidded across at the designated location. At completion of skidding at this crossing the trail must be left flat and free of debris. The trail must be left free of any slash or other debris. Signage informing trail users of the timber sale must be placed on the NCT.
 - The NCT will be crossed at a designated place, if at all, as determined by the sale administrator.
 - According to the Bayfield County Access Management plan the existing roads within this sale are open to highway vehicle use. Upon completion of the timber sale these roads will be left open unless otherwise directed by the sale administrator.
 - Do not cut snags except for those that pose a safety hazard.
 - To comply with the Best Management Practices for Invasive Species: Prior to moving equipment onto or off of the sale area, scrape or brush soil and debris from exterior surfaces to the extent practical.
 - Decking of wood along town roads will not be allowed without permission from Bayfield County.
 - If harvest will utilize the whole tree, 1 in 10 tops must be left scattered throughout the sale.
 - This contract requires County authorization for all road/landing construction and places a number of other requirements on road construction and closure.
