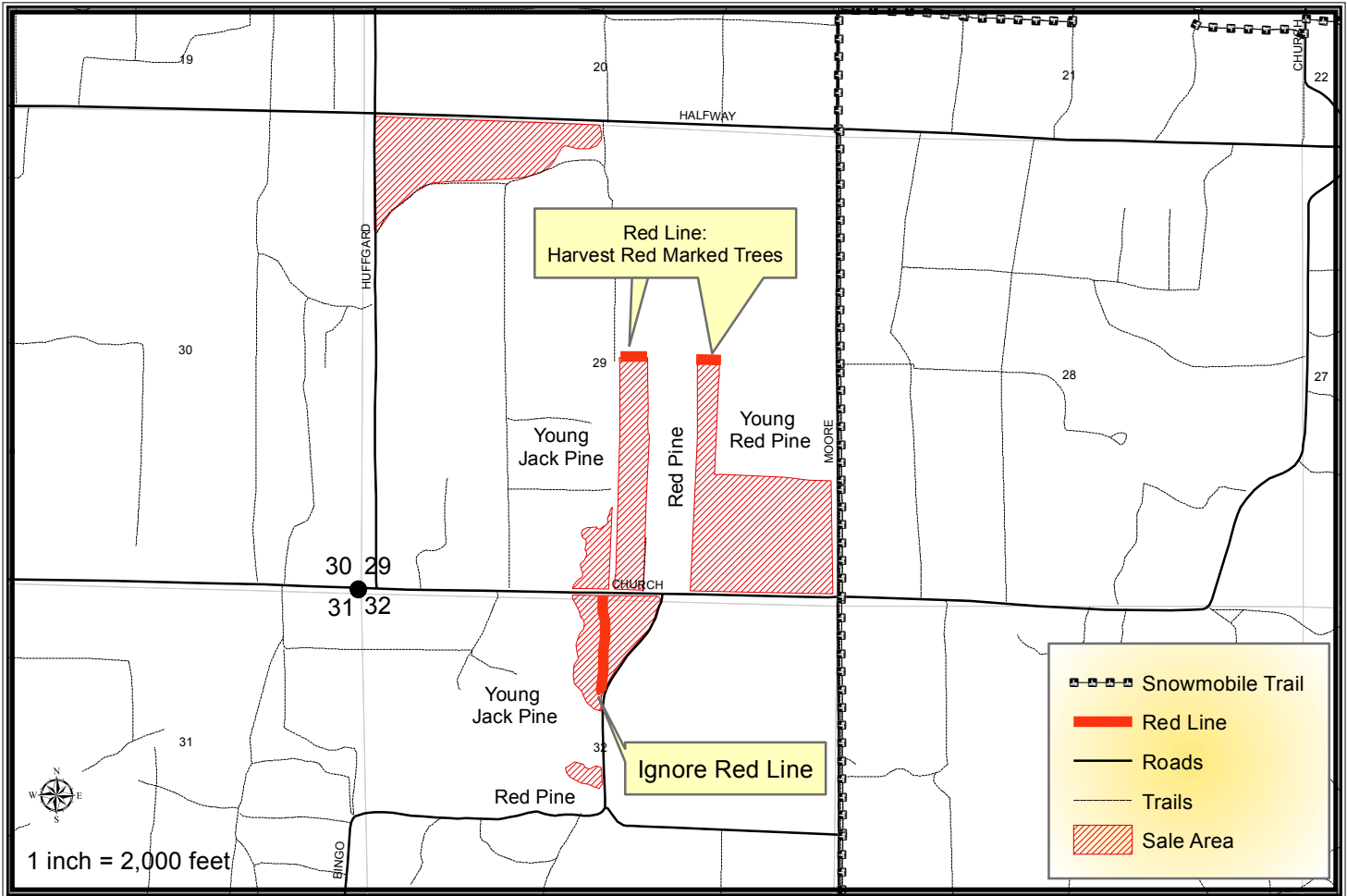

Harvest Requirements:

- Sale is a clearcut being sold on a Ticket Scale Basis.
- Sale boundaries consist of red paint line, abrupt change in timber type to red pine or young jack pine, roads or a snowmobile trail.
- Harvest all merchantable timber and sever all non-merchantable stems 2" in diameter and greater.
- On the north line of the north unit harvest red marked trees.
- Cut all snags. There is approximately 20 sq.ft. per acre of standing dead PJ scattered throughout the sale area. Any dead trees that the contractor chooses to utilize will be paid for at the contract rates.
- Harvested pine cannot be kept on the Bayfield County Forest for more than three weeks from May 1st to August 31st.
- During winter harvesting the snowmobile trail must be kept unobstructed and in a packed snow condition. The purchaser must ensure that harvesting and hauling operations will not create a safety hazard to snowmobiles.
- To comply with the Best Management Practices for Invasive Species: Prior to moving equipment onto or off of the sale area, scrape or brush soil and debris from exterior surfaces to the extent practical.
- Decking of wood along town roads will not be allowed without permission from Bayfield County.
- If harvest will utilize the whole tree, 1 in 10 tops must be left scattered throughout the sale.
- This contract requires County authorization for all road/landing construction and places a number of other requirements on road construction and closure.
