

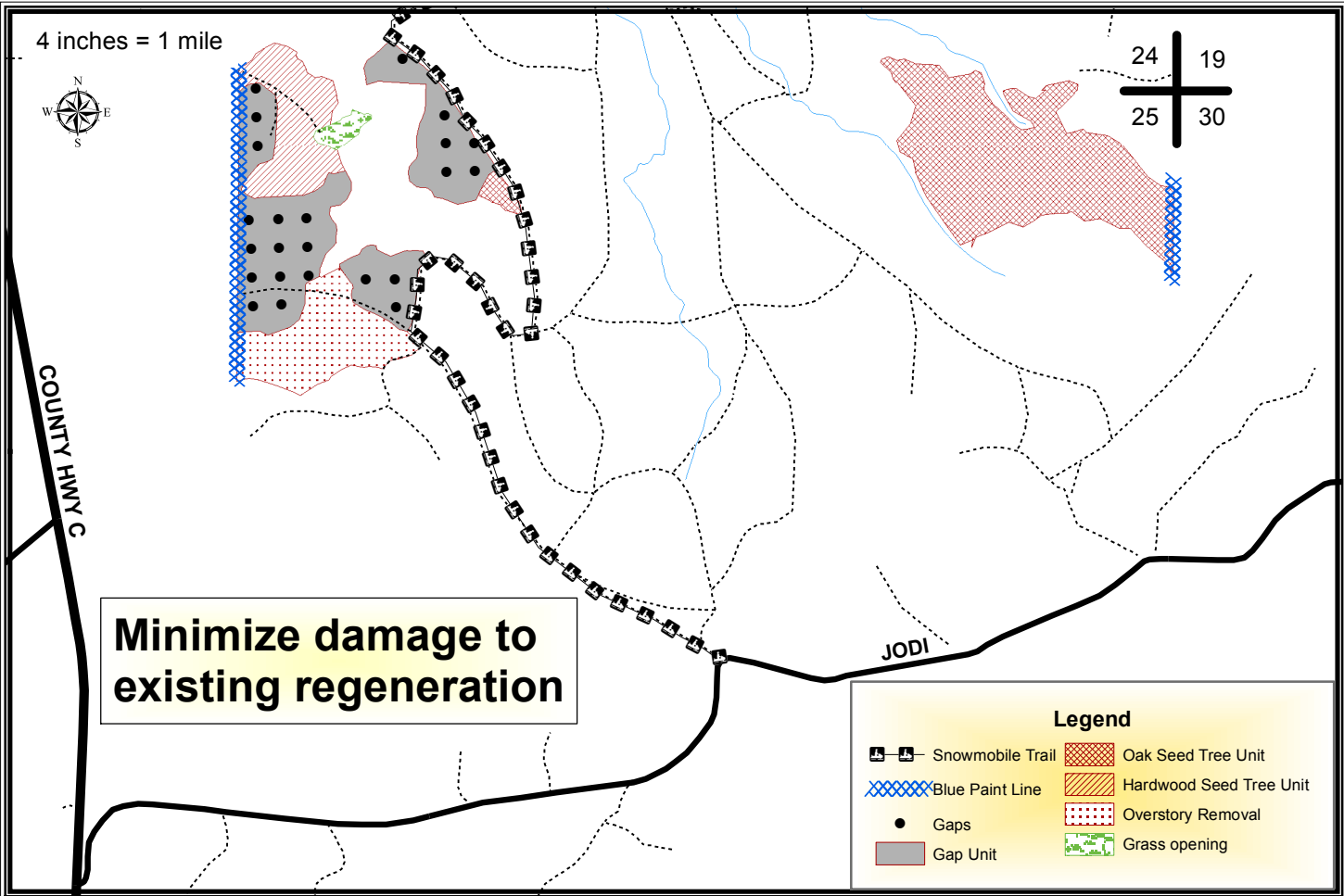

## Harvest Requirements:

- Sale is being sold on a Ticket Scale Basis
- Sale boundaries consist of red paint line, blue paint line, young aspen, or open field
- The blue paint line indicates private property. No equipment or felled trees may cross this line.
- Gap Unit: The gaps are 100 feet in diameter. There are 8-12 purple painted trees on the perimeter with two dots facing in towards the gap with a purple slash on the backside of each tree. Harvest all hardwood stems 1" in diameter and greater within the gaps. There are no trees marked for removal between gaps. However, operational trees may be taken focusing on the smallest and lowest quality trees. **No sale operations allowed between breakup and July 15<sup>th</sup>.**
- Oak Seed Tree Unit: Leave all purple marked trees and all conifer except harvest balsam fir 4" and greater. Harvest all hardwood stems 2" and greater. **In this unit only, sale operations may only occur when the ground is frozen unless written permission is granted by Bayfield County.**
- Hardwood Seed Tree Unit: Leave all purple marked trees and all conifer except harvest balsam fir 4" and greater. Harvest all hardwood stems 4" and greater. **Minimize damage to existing regeneration, except ironwood in this unit.**
- Overstory Removal Unit: Leave all purple marked trees and all conifer. Harvest all hardwood stems 4" and greater. **Minimize damage to existing regeneration, except ironwood in this unit.**
- During winter harvesting the snowmobile trail must be kept unobstructed and in a packed snow condition. The purchaser must ensure that harvesting and hauling operations will not create a safety hazard to snowmobiles.
- Do not cut snags except for those that pose a safety hazard.
- To comply with the Best Management Practices for Invasive Species: Prior to moving equipment onto or off of the sale area, scrape or brush soil and debris from exterior surfaces to the extent practical.
- Decking of wood along town roads will not be allowed without permission from Bayfield County.
- If harvest will utilize the whole tree, 1 in 10 tops must be left scattered throughout the sale.
- This contract requires County authorization for all road/landing construction and places a number of other requirements on road construction and closure.
