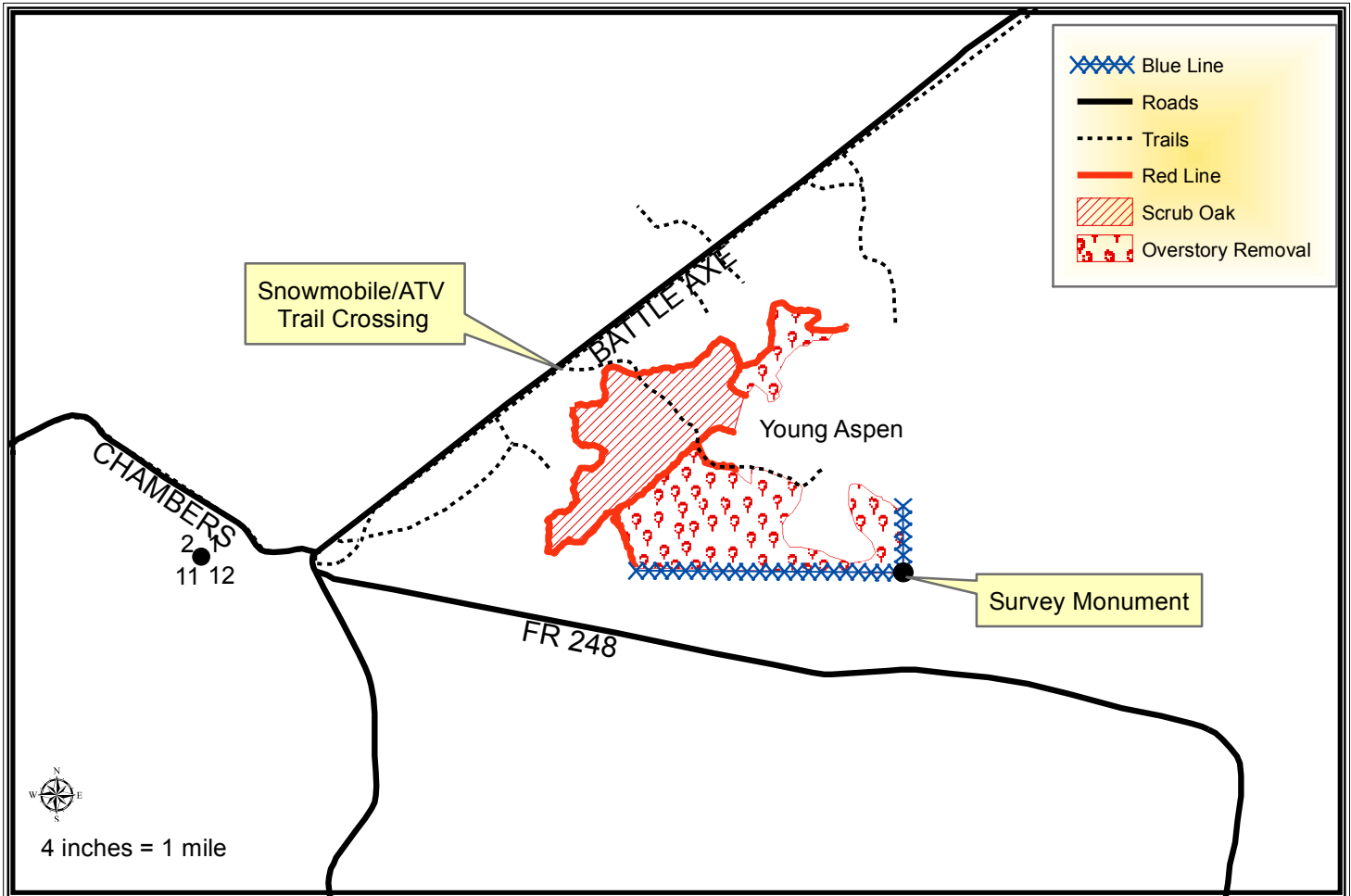

Harvest Requirements:

- Sale is being sold on a Ticket Scale Basis
- Boundaries consist of red paint line, blue paint line and abrupt timber type changes to young aspen.
- The blue paint line indicates private property. No equipment or felled trees may cross the line.
- **Overstory Removal:** Harvest all merchantable stems. **Advanced regeneration is present and damage to young trees must be minimized.** No whole tree skidding will be allowed in this unit.
- **Scrub Oak Coppice:** Harvest all merchantable hardwood stems and jack pine. Leave all conifer except jack pine. Sever all non-merchantable hardwood stems 2" in diameter and greater.
- A snowmobile/atv trail runs parallel to the south side of Battle Ax Road and must be crossed to access the sale. The trail must be kept in a safe and unobstructed condition. The purchaser must insure that harvesting and hauling operation will not create a safety hazard. Signage must be used to warn snowmobiles/atvs of the danger and if the sale is harvested in the winter the crossing must be kept in a packed snow condition
- Do not cut snags except for those that pose a safety hazard.
- Do not damage any survey monumentation.
- To comply with the Best Management Practices for Invasive Species: Prior to moving equipment onto or off of the sale area, scrape or brush soil and debris from exterior surfaces to the extent practical.
- Decking of wood along town roads will not be allowed without permission from Bayfield County.
- If harvest will utilize the whole tree, 1 in 10 tops must be left scattered throughout the sale.
- This contract requires County authorization for all road/landing construction and places a number of other requirements on road construction and closure.
