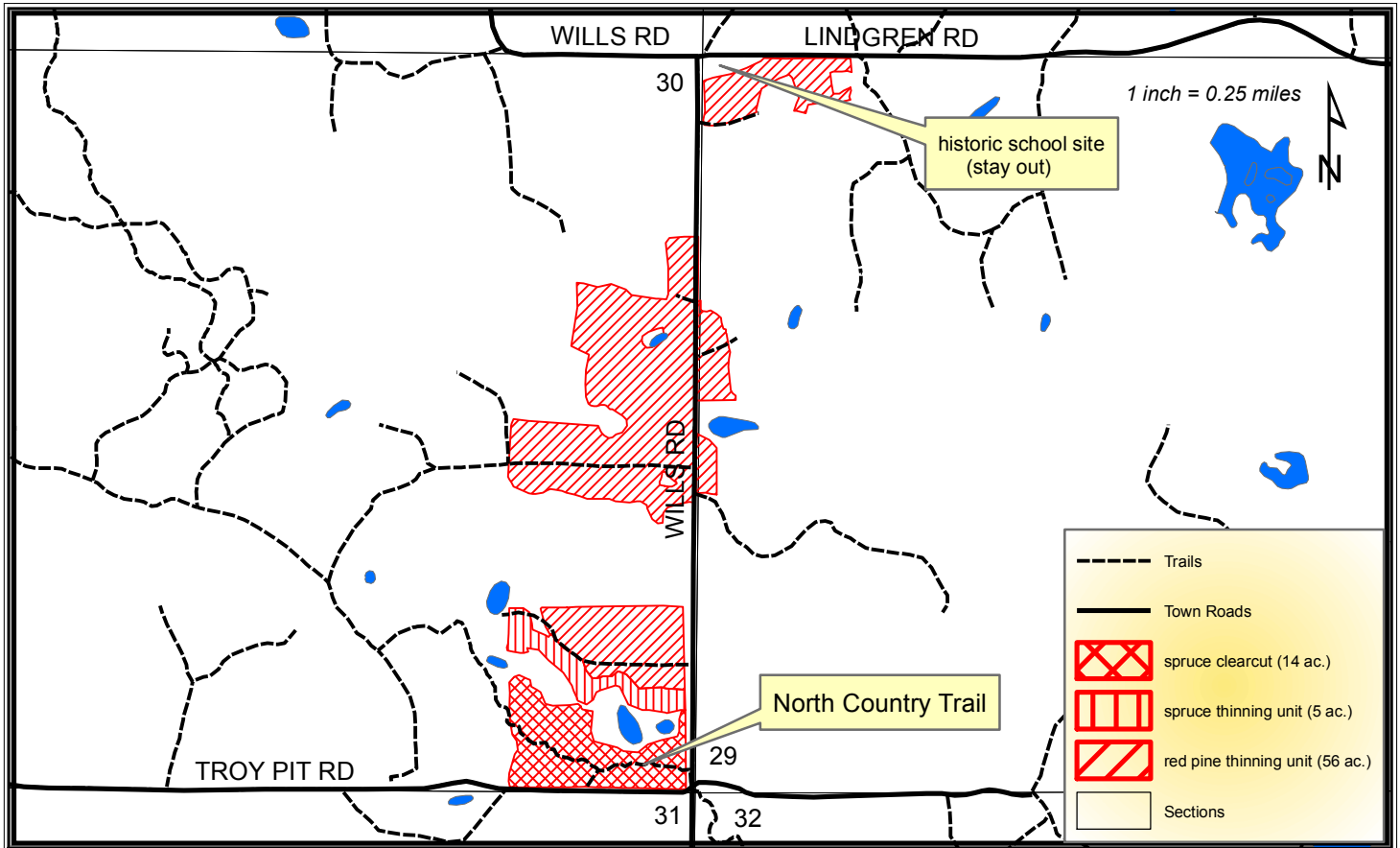

Harvest Requirements:

- This 75 acre sale is composed of a 3rd thinning red pine/white spruce plantation, and white spruce clearcut. Sale is being sold on a Ticket Scale Basis.
- Sale boundaries are identifiable on the ground by abrupt changes in timber types (red pine plantations end), by the road, and by red paint that splits the white spruce thinning from the white spruce clearcut.
- There are a number of kegs within the sale where all un-marked trees within 15ft of these kegs need to be left.
- PRESCRIPTION:
 - Pine/Spruce Thinning: Harvest all orange-painted trees as well as jack pine, aspen, maple, and white birch. Leave all oak.
 - Spruce Clearcut: Harvest all white spruce not marked in blue or purple paint. Harvest all jack pine, aspen, maple, and white birch. Leave all oak.
 - In the town road right of ways (50' from the centerline) within the sale areas, harvest all merchantable trees.
- **Within the white spruce clearcut advanced regeneration is present and damage must be minimized.**
- Sale is restricted to short wood logging only.
- The North Country Trail runs through the stand. Do not cut blue-painted trees. Keep slash 18" or less within 25 ft of the North Country Trail. Do not operate machinery on the North Country Trail, except where approved by the Sale Administrator. Trail must be signed to provide safety for trail users.
- Harvested pine & spruce cannot be kept on the Bayfield County Forest for more than 3 weeks from May 1st to August 31st.
- Do not damage any survey monuments.
- To comply with the Best Management Practices for Invasive Species: Prior to moving equipment onto or off of the sale area, scrape or brush soil and debris from exterior surfaces of the logging equipment.
- Decking of wood along town roads will not be allowed without permission from Bayfield County Forestry Department
- This contract requires County authorization for all road/landing construction and places a number of other requirements on road construction and closure. (refer to Section 17)
