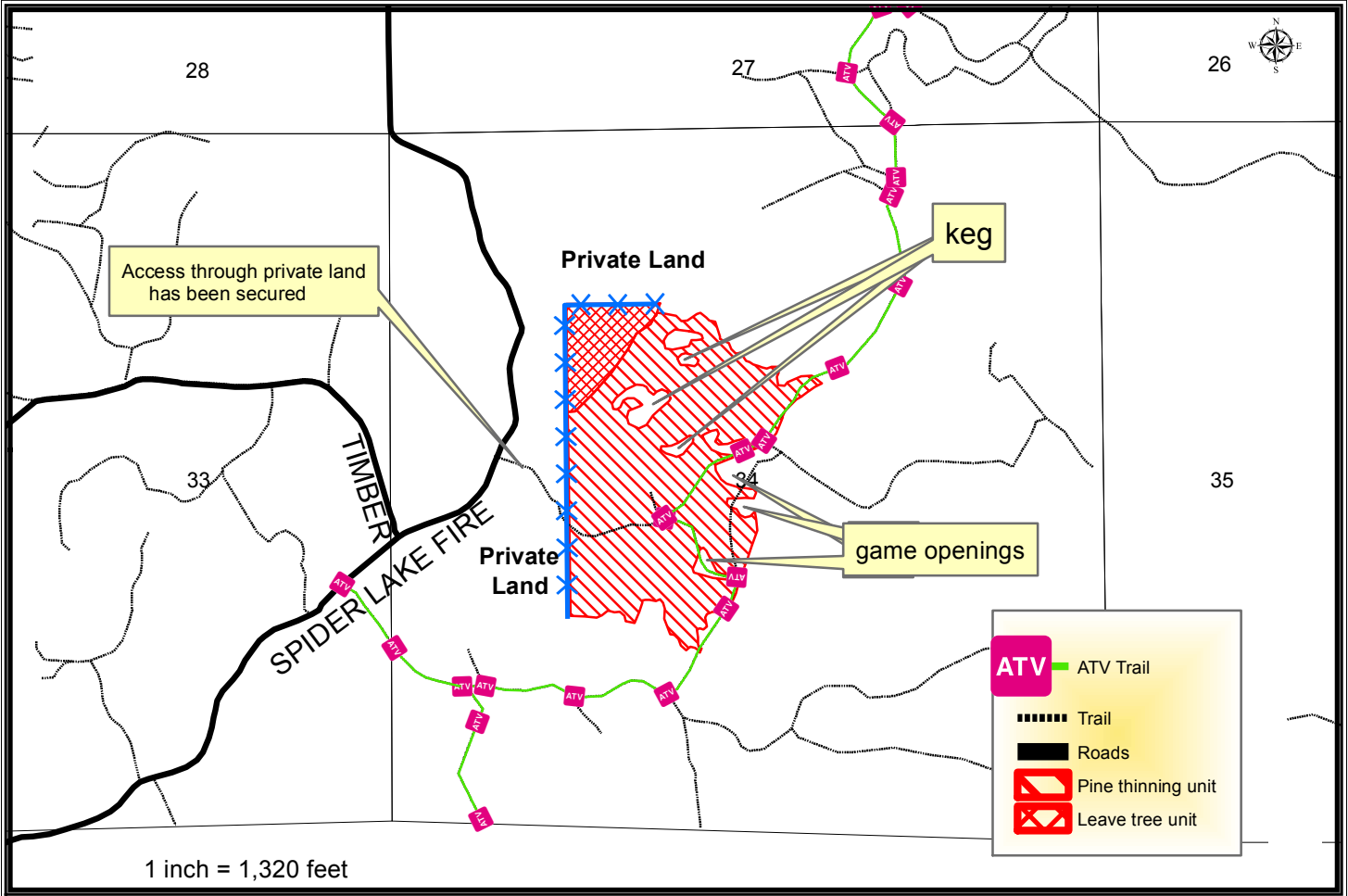

Harvest Requirements:

- Sale is a pine thinning and leave tree harvest that will be sold on a Ticket Scale Basis
- Sale is on steep terrain. A thorough sale inspection prior to bidding to insure a contractor's equipment can safely harvest these slopes is necessary.
- Sale boundaries include: roads, blue line, and red paint lines noting both a change in prescription and sale boundaries
- White Pine thinning unit: harvest all orange painted white pine and red pine. Harvest all jack pine, all merchantable hardwood not painted purple and all merchantable spruce and fir. Sever all non-merchantable hardwood stems 2" and greater. A few purple painted oak are on the east side of this sale north of the ATV trail
- Leave Tree unit: harvest all merchantable trees that are not painted in purple paint. Sever all non-merchantable hardwood stems 2" and greater.
- Portions of the haul route for this timber sale use the ATV trail. Excessive damage (beyond normal wear and tear) to the ATV trail, as determined by Bayfield County, will not be tolerated. If Bayfield County determines excessive damage has occurred, the Contractor may be held responsible for a portion or the entire repair. The County and Contractor must communicate on a regular basis to ensure issues are addressed in a timely manner and the ATV trail remains in a safe and acceptable condition.
- Access road off Spider Lake Fire land is through Forestland Group property of which the County has an easement allowing access. Trail must be returned to equal or better condition upon completion of timber sale as determined by the sale administrator.
- Do not cut snags except for those that pose a safety hazard.
- There are a few wet kegs present within the sale north of the ATV trail. No harvesting is allowed within 15 ft of the wetlands.
- To comply with the Best Management Practices for Invasive Species: Prior to moving equipment onto or off of the sale area, scrape or brush soil and debris from exterior surfaces to the extent practical.
- The west and north side of this sale borders private property. Outside of using the agreed upon access road no trees or equipment related to harvesting may cross this blue paint line.
- Harvested pine cannot be kept on the Bayfield County Forest for more than three weeks from May 1st to August 31st.
- If harvest will utilize the whole tree, 1 in 10 tops must be left scattered throughout the sale.
- This contract requires County authorization for all road/landing construction and places a number of other requirements on road construction and closure.
