

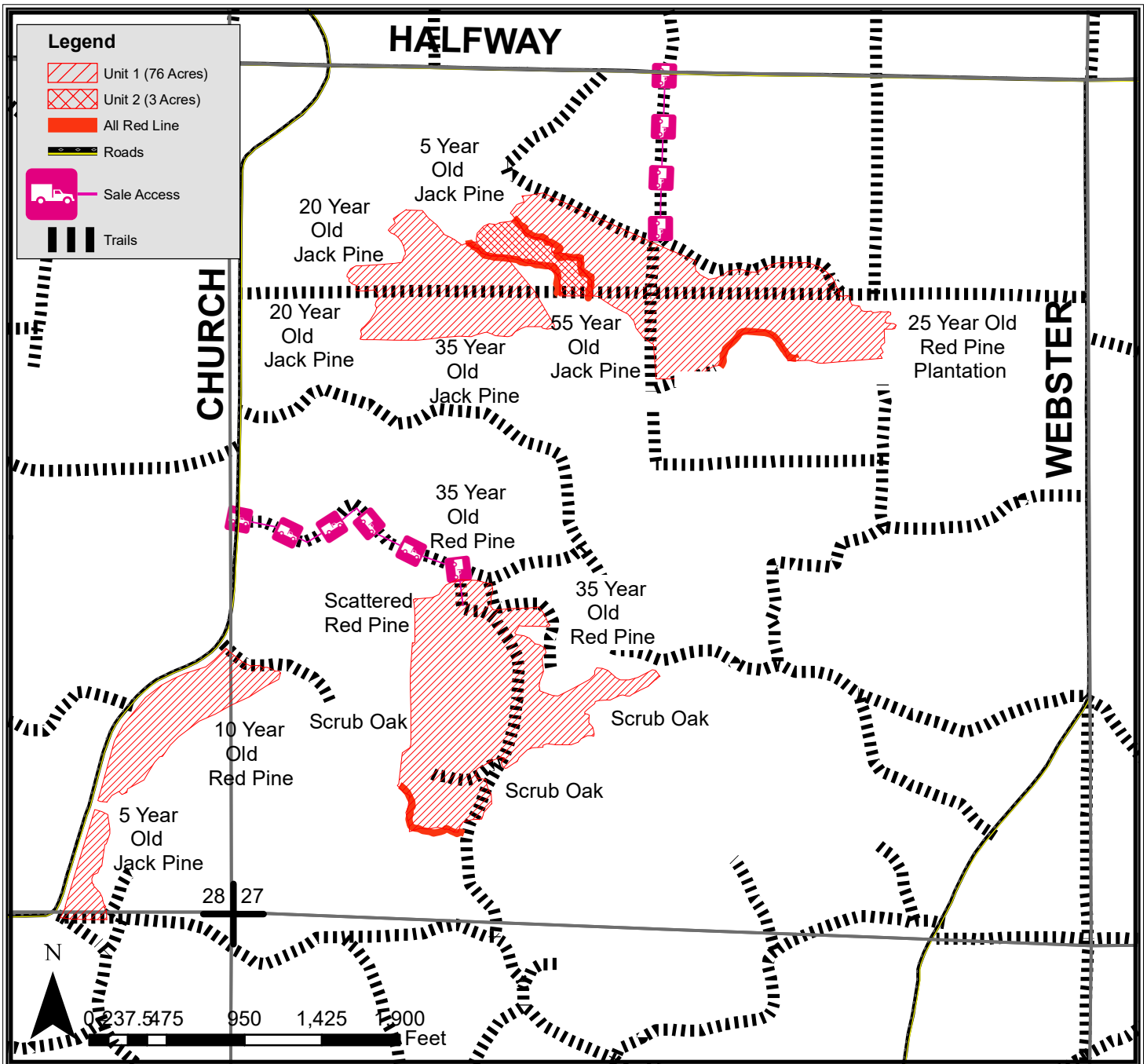

TRACT 25-21 – SUPPLEMENTAL REQUIREMENTS

The following terms and conditions supplement those provided in the Bayfield County Timber Sale Contract.

A. PRESCRIPTION:

1. Unit 1 has a red pine thinning prescription with an estimated averaged residual basal area of 89ft².
2. Unit 2 has a red pine row thinning prescription with an estimated averaged residual basal area of 117ft².

B. HARVEST REQUIREMENTS:

1. Unit 1, cut all orange marked trees and avoid damage to all residual un-marked trees.
2. Unit 2, cut all pine and other species in every third row (cut one row, leave two rows). Cut rows are not marked with paint. Logger will determine cut rows to the satisfaction of the Sale Administrator. Avoid damaged to all residual trees.

C. HARVEST AND OPERATIONAL REQUIREMENTS AND SEASONAL RESTRICTIONS:

1. Harvested pine cannot be kept on the Bayfield County Forest for more than three weeks from May 1st to August 31st.
2. No seasonal soil restrictions.
3. Sale boundaries consist of red paint line, trails, young red pine plantations, jack pine, scrub oak, and an abrupt change to larger scattered red pine.
4. Utilization specification is to a 4" top. However, if the County determines that pulpwood markets continue to be very poor at the time of harvest the County will sign a contract amendment with the purchaser changing the utilization specification to a 5" top for selected species. When determining condition of the market, the County will pay particular attention to the amount of wood being purchased by the mills in Wisconsin Rapids and any other significant shifts in wood demand.
5. If harvest will utilize the whole tree, 1 in 10 tops must be left scattered throughout the sale.
6. Do not damage any survey monumentation.
7. Do not cut snags except for individuals that pose a safety hazard.

D. ACCESS AND ROADS:

1. This contract requires County authorization for all road/landing construction and places a number of other requirements on road construction and closure.
2. Decking of wood along town roads will not be allowed without permission from Bayfield County.

E. OTHER:

1. To comply with Best Management Practices for Invasive Species: Prior to moving equipment onto or off the sale area, scrape or brush soil and debris from exterior surfaces to the extent practical.
