Great Lakes Timber Professionals Association (GLTPA) is pleased to send this letter of support for the application of Bayfield County, Wisconsin to be awarded a RAISE grant to fund critical infrastructure needs. Bayfield County is a rural area in NW Wisconsin which relies heavily on tourism and sustainable forest management for its economic well-being. Bayfield County is exemplary in demonstrating how a local government is balancing recreation and industry, and GLTPA commends Bayfield County for taking this bold step to ensure the balance continues for the future.

Bayfield County officials place high priority on the wellbeing and safety of the citizens they represent. The RAISE Grant will help continue this trend with reconstruction of a 22-mile stretch of County Hwy A which will provide a significant improvement in traveler safety, provide year-round access to county forest lands for recreation and management, and provide support for the growing number of EV's with Electric Vehicle Charging Stations (EVCS) along this scenic route.

The improvements to this main county corridor include significant upgrading of the road base with enhanced drainage for water quality improvement, re-surfacing with paved road edges, and improved shoulders to support year-round tourism commerce, economic development opportunities, and quicker response times for emergency situations.

GLTPA recognizes the significance Highway A provides to the county and region's economy and we hope you give this project serious consideration for funding. This project's improvements are consistent with the RAISE grants goals and will create immediate opportunity for local business to improve revenue and strengthen the counties rural communities.
