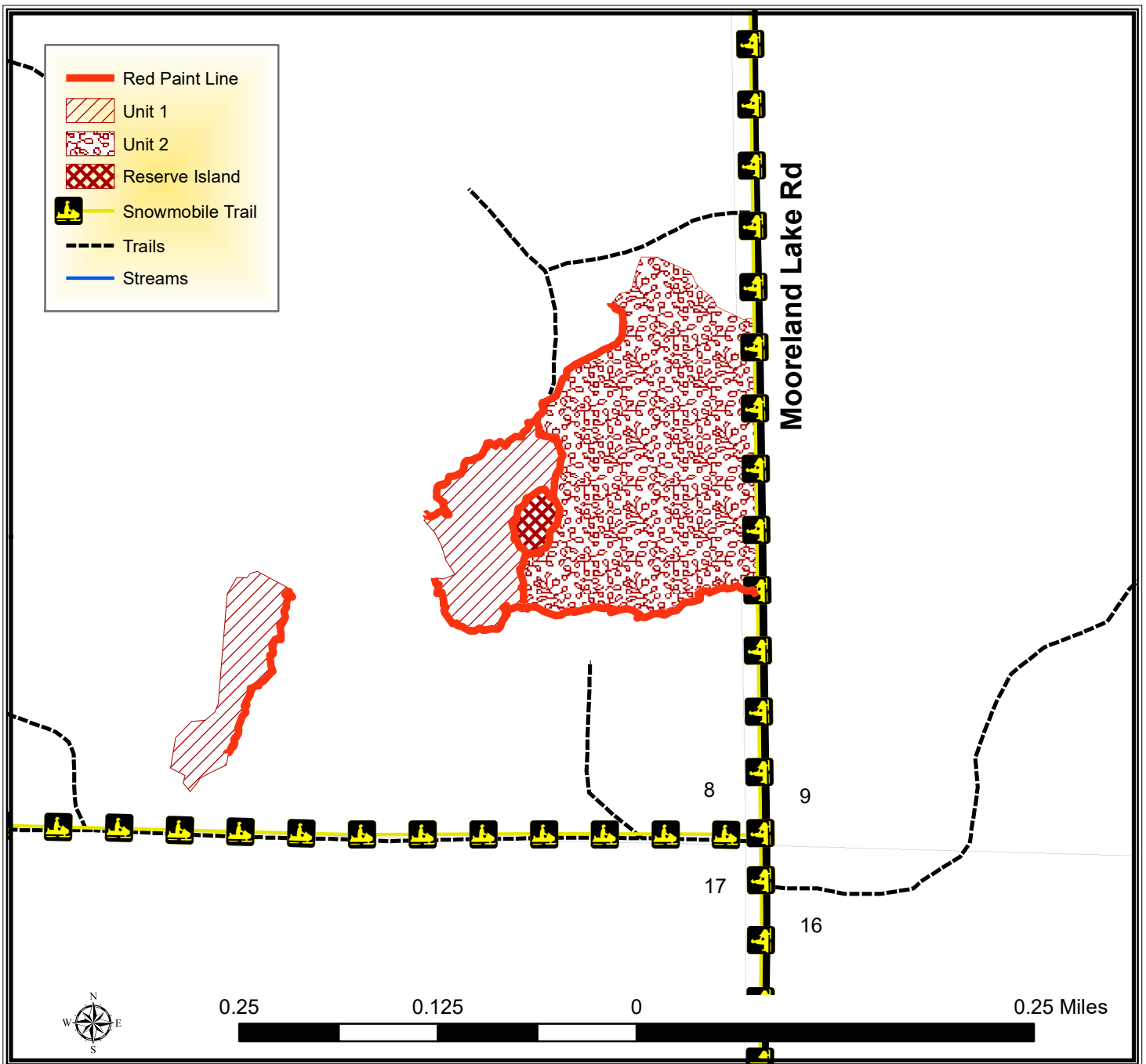

TRACT 03-23 – HARVEST REQUIREMENTS

The following terms and conditions supplement those provided in the Bayfield County Timber Sale Contract.

A. PRESCRIPTION:

1. Harvest unit 1 has a coppice with reserves prescription with an estimated average residual basal area of 20 ft².
2. Harvest unit 2 has a clearcut prescription with an estimated average residual basal area of 0 ft².

B. HARVEST REQUIREMENTS:

1. In unit 1, harvest all hardwood and jack pine stems 2 inches and greater. Leave all conifer except jack pine.
2. In unit 1, do not cut snags except for individuals that pose a safety hazard.
3. In unit 2, harvest all stems 2 inches and greater.

C. OPERATIONAL REQUIREMENTS AND SEASONAL RESTRICTIONS:

1. Harvested pine must be hauled within three weeks between the May 1st and August 31st.
2. Sale boundaries consist of red paint line, roads, and recent harvests.
3. Whole tree harvesting and/or utilization of tops (≤4" diameter) will not be allowed.

D. ACCESS AND ROADS:

1. During winter harvesting, the snowmobile trails must be kept unobstructed and in a packed snow condition. The purchaser must ensure that harvesting and hauling operations will not create a safety hazard to snowmobiles. Avoid damage to signs and trail markers.
2. This contract requires County authorization for all road/landing construction and places a number of other requirements on road construction and closure.
3. Decking of wood along town roads will not be allowed without permission from Bayfield County.

E. OTHER:

1. To comply with Best Management Practices for Invasive Species: Prior to moving equipment onto or off the sale area, scrape or brush soil and debris from exterior surfaces to the extent practical.
