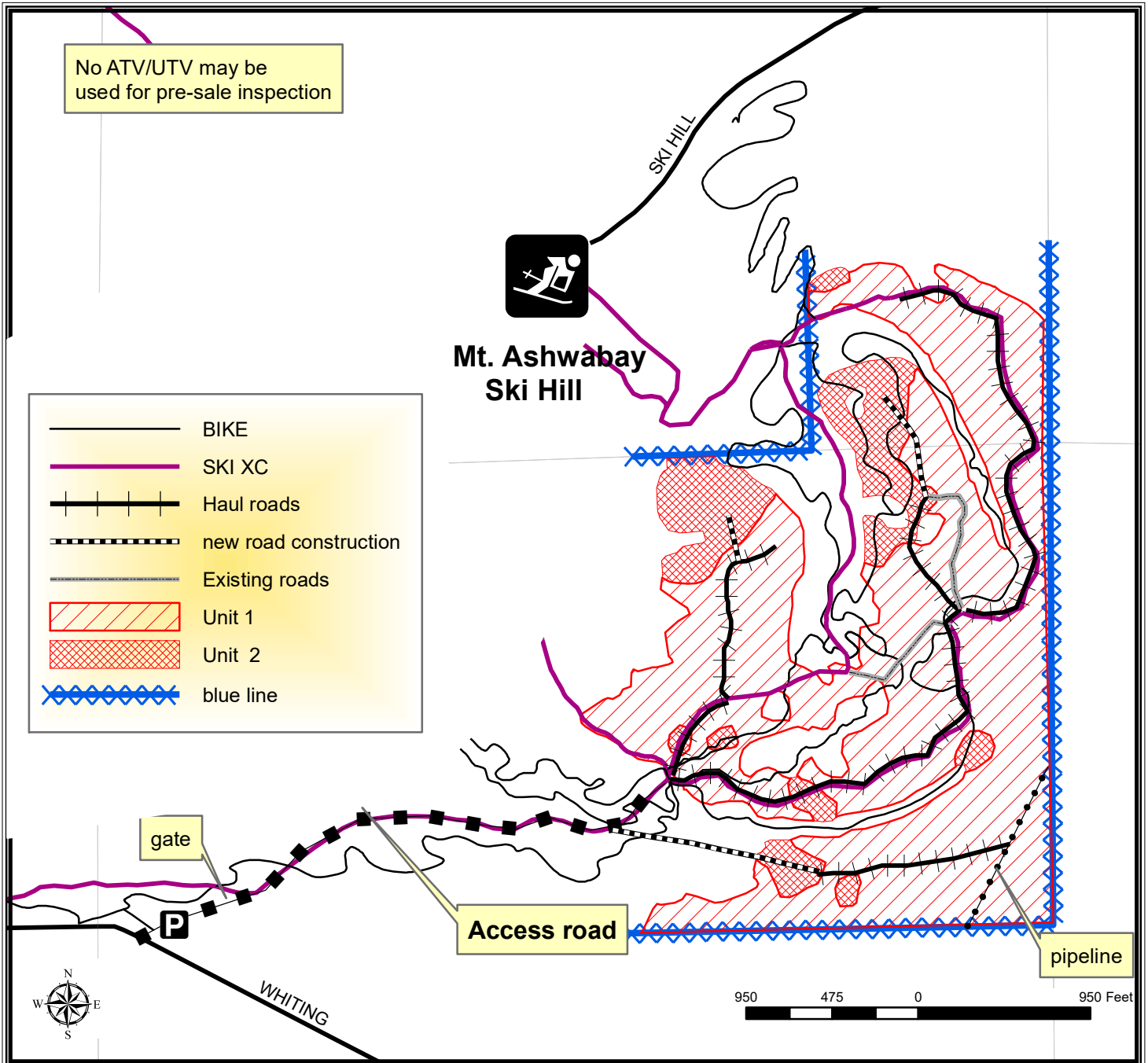

TRACT 27-21 – HARVEST REQUIREMENTS

The following terms and conditions supplement those provided in the Bayfield County Timber Sale Contract.

A. PRESCRIPTION:

1. Harvest unit 1 has a thinning prescription with an estimated average residual basal area of 95 ft².
2. Harvest unit 2 has a coppice prescription with an estimated average residual basal area of 23 ft².

B. HARVEST REQUIREMENTS:

1. Unit 1: Harvest all orange painted trees.
2. Unit 2: Sever all hardwood stems 2" in diameter and greater. Leave all purple painted trees and all conifers.

C. OPERATIONAL REQUIREMENTS AND SEASONAL RESTRICTIONS:

1. Sale boundaries consist of red paint line, blue paint line, ski trail, and young aspen.
2. This sale is restricted to short wood logging.
3. There are cross country ski trails, summer mountain bike trails and winter fat biking trails present within this sale. Specific restrictions regarding use, crossing, slash, etc. will be implemented on both summer mtn bike trails and ski trails. In agreement with the rec. club responsible for maintaining the fat bike trails no special restrictions will be implemented.
4. The trails that will be used as haul routes are noted on the map. Care must be given to protect these trails and return them to an acceptable condition upon completion of the sale as determined by the sale administrator. Summer Mtn Bike Trails: Damage to these bike trails will not be tolerated, crossing of bike trails for logging purposes will be designated by the sale administrator, ski and bike trails must be kept free of debris throughout sale operations.
5. There are recreation events such as bike races that utilize parts of this timber sale. These will only be on weekends. The County may cease harvesting and trucking for up to three weekends annually.
6. No sale operations permitted when there is more than 2 inches of snow on the ground.
7. To prevent two- chestnut borer damage, minimize bark peeling, and to protect from oak wilt: No sale operations allowed between breakup and July 15th
8. Decking of wood will be allowed along the haul roads as determined by the sale administrator. Care must be made to not deck wood that physically obstructs the trails. No more than 25 cords can remain decked over winter.
9. No decking of wood or staging of equipment will be allowed in the Whiting rd. parking lot.
10. Portions of the roads on this timber sale are used as cross country ski trails in the winter. Due to incompatibility with skis, fractured rock may not be placed on the ski trail sections. Crushed gravel, approved by the sale administrator, is permitted.
11. Slash must be pulled back or compacted to within 12 inches of the ground within 25 feet of the mountain bike and ski trails.
12. The blue line indicates private property. No equipment or felled trees may cross the line.
13. There is a gas pipeline located within the sale area as noted on the map. Diggers hotline must be contacted, and all conditions placed on crossing the pipeline must be followed. In the past they have requested that a soil lift be used where the road crosses the line
14. If harvest will utilize the whole tree, 1 in 10 tops must be left scattered throughout the sale.

D. ACCESS AND ROADS:

1. Access is off Whiting road as noted on the sale map. Access road goes through the mountain bike parking lot. The county will post signs to make the trail users aware of the logging operation and post signs at the parking lot to ensure adequate space for logging trucks to pass. The county may incorporate additional measures within the parking lot area to ensure there is adequate space for logging trucks to safely enter and leave the parking lot area.
2. All access roads for this sale have been designated. Additional roads will not be authorized.

E. OTHER:

1. To comply with Best Management Practices for Invasive Species: Prior to moving equipment onto or off the sale area, scrape or brush soil and debris from exterior surfaces to the extent practical.
2. Do not damage any survey monumentation.
