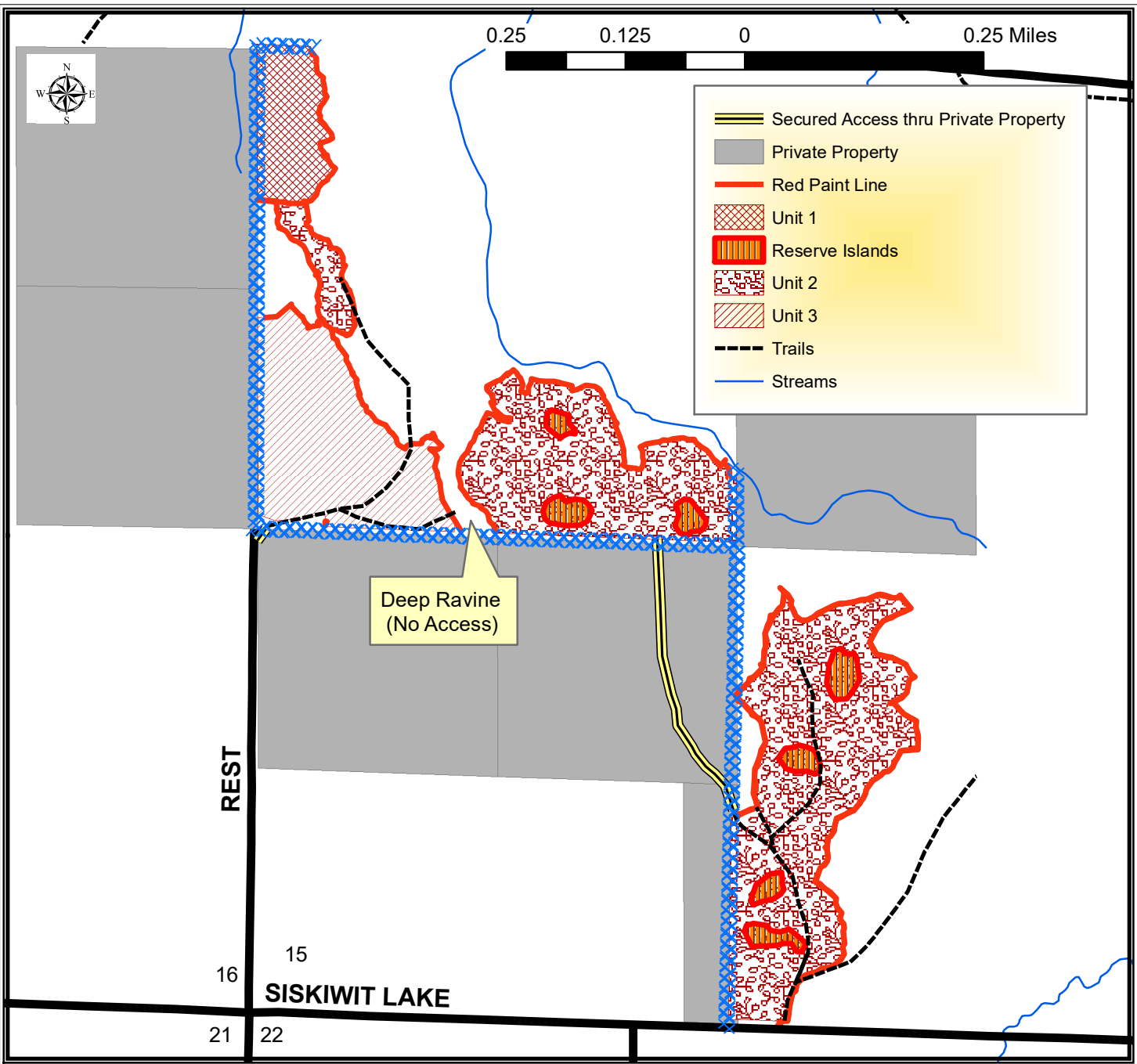

TRACT 50-22 – HARVEST REQUIREMENTS

The following terms and conditions supplement those provided in the Bayfield County Timber Sale Contract.

A. PRESCRIPTION:

1. Harvest unit 1 has a thinning prescription with an estimated average residual basal area of 123 ft².
2. Harvest unit 2 has a clearcut with reserves prescription with an estimated average residual basal area of 29 ft².
3. Harvest unit 3 has a coppice with reserves prescription with an estimated average residual basal area of 2 ft².

B. HARVEST REQUIREMENTS:

1. In unit 1, harvest all orange marked trees, all aspen and hardwood 2 inches and greater. Leave all unmarked conifer.
2. In unit 2, harvest all red pine, aspen, and hardwood (except oak) 6 inches and greater. Leave all oak and all conifer that is not red pine.
3. In unit 3, harvest all aspen and unmarked hardwood stems 2 inches and greater. Leave all conifer and purple marked trees.

C. OPERATIONAL REQUIREMENTS AND SEASONAL RESTRICTIONS:

1. Sale operations may only occur when the ground is frozen or in exceptionally dry conditions, as determined by the county.
2. Harvested pine cannot be kept on the Bayfield County Forest for more than three weeks from May 1st to August 31st.
3. The blue paint line indicates private property. No equipment or felled trees may cross the line.
4. If harvest will utilize the whole tree, 1 in 10 tops must be left scattered throughout the sale.

D. ACCESS AND ROADS:

1. Bayfield County has secured access through 2 landowners for access to portions of the sale.
2. A few trees will need to be harvested from the access road on private property. These trees will be piled in a designated location for the landowner to utilize.
3. This contract requires County authorization for all road/landing construction and places a number of other requirements on road construction and closure.
4. Decking of wood along town roads will not be allowed without permission from Bayfield County.

E. OTHER:

1. To comply with Best Management Practices for Invasive Species:
Prior to moving equipment onto or off the sale area, scrape or brush soil and debris from exterior surfaces to the extent practical.
