

## Twin Bear & Delta Lake Campground Rules & Regulations

- ✓ **Quiet Hours:** Quiet hours are strictly enforced from 10:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. All campers are required to pay extra attention to their noise levels during this time. Noise must be kept at a level that is not disturbing neighbors or others in the campground. Excessive noise is defined as anything (i.e., voice, radio, television, instrument, pet, etc.) that can be clearly heard from a distance of at least 15 feet and is causing a disturbance, as determined by the campground manager. The campground manager will issue a verbal warning when a violation of quiet hours has been observed. A written warning will be issued for the second offense. Those who fail to honor quiet hours a third time may be required to leave the campground without refund.
- ✓ **Noise:** Excessive noise will not be tolerated at any time. All noise must be kept at a level that will not cause undue or unnecessary disturbances in the campground.
- ✓ **Number of Camping Units:** No more than 1 camping unit will be allowed to occupy a campsite, unless otherwise designated or approved by Bayfield County. A camping unit includes, but is not limited to, an RV, pop-up, tent, or anything that will provide nighttime shelter to be used as a camp by a camping party. Other structures not intended to provide nighttime shelter (i.e., screened canopies, gazebos, etc.) may be allowed, but only if the site can accommodate such structures without interfering with the aesthetic appearance of the area as determined by Bayfield County. If extra camping units are approved, an additional fee may be applied.
- ✓ **Number of Occupants:** No more than 8 people will be allowed to occupy one campsite. Parties larger than 8 people will be required to rent multiple campsites or pay an additional fee per person. If more than 8 people are permitted at a campsite, as determined by Bayfield County, each additional person will be charged \$5.00 per night.
- ✓ **Speed Limits:** The maximum speed limit is 5 mph unless posted otherwise.
- ✓ **Firewood:** To help slow the spread of various tree diseases and invasive species, if travelling from a distance greater than 10 miles of the campground, please do not bring in your own firewood. Purchase wood locally (within a 10-mile radius) or on the premises (see campground manager). State and Federal regulations on the possession and transportation of firewood are enforced.
- ✓ **Fireworks:** Fireworks are prohibited within the campground.
- ✓ **Firearms:** Firearms of any kind are prohibited within the campground unless the firearm is unloaded and enclosed within a carrying case. This includes, but is not limited to, BB guns, pellet guns, air guns, paintball guns, slingshots, bows, and crossbows. Discharging a firearm within the campground is strictly prohibited.
- ✓ **Hunting:** Hunting, trapping or disturbing wildlife in any manner is strictly prohibited within the campground.
- ✓ **Motorized Recreational Vehicles:** Recreational motorized vehicles (i.e., ATVs, golf carts, scooters, etc.) are permitted within the campground, but only at speeds of 5 mph or less and only on graveled roadways. These vehicles are not permitted on access ramps, the beach area or campsites not rented by the vehicle's owner. Inappropriate use of these vehicles will not be tolerated.
- ✓ **Non-Motorized Recreational Vehicles:** The use of non-motorized vehicles is permitted within the campground. However, bikes, skateboards, rollerblades, or similar non-motorized vehicles are not permitted on docks or in other rented campsites, beach areas, wooded areas or the wooden access ramp that leads down to the beach. These vehicles are only allowed on graveled roadways or other areas designated by the County with a sign.
- ✓ **Pets:** Pets are permitted within the campground but are not allowed to roam free at any time. All pets must be kept on a leash or otherwise under control at all times. It is the camper's responsibility to clean up after their pets and control excessive noise. Failure to control a pet, including cleaning up after it and/or controlling excessive noise, will result in the owner being required to remove the animal from the campground. Those who repeatedly fail to control their pets, or those who refuse to remove their animal from the campground, may also be required to leave the campground without refund.

- ✓ **Parking:** Park vehicles in your own campsites or in designated parking areas. Do not park in unoccupied campsites. No more than two vehicles will be allowed to park at each campsite. That number may be reduced to just one if other items (i.e., boat trailers, ATVs, golf carts, etc.) are also parked on site. Campsites are not designed to accommodate numerous vehicles.
- ✓ **Boat Launch:** A pass is required to launch all personal watercraft (i.e., motorboats, row boats, pontoons, canoes, kayaks, jet skis, etc.) from the boat launch located within the campground. Daily, weekly, monthly, and seasonal passes are available (please see the campground manager for current pricing). The launch pass is valid at all county owned boat launch locations – Twin Bear Campground, Delta Lake Campground and Atkins Lake Park. A launch pass will cover all watercraft owned by the individual named on the permit. A separate pass is not required for each individual watercraft.
- ✓ **Boats and Boat Trailers:** Boats and boat trailers need to be parked in designated areas. Not all sites can accommodate trailers. If your site cannot accommodate a trailer and the campground manager determines that no other parking options are available, you will be required to remove your trailer from the campground. Please see the campground manager for additional information.
- ✓ **Boat Mooring:** If applicable, boat mooring spots are available throughout the campground and are distributed on a first come first served basis. Mooring boats along the beach area or shoreline is prohibited, unless otherwise approved by Bayfield County. If you want to leave your boat in the water, it must be moored in the designated locations. If a boat mooring spot is unavailable, the boat will have to be removed from the water after each use. If a boat mooring spot is unavailable and you are renting a site at the campground, you will not be required to purchase a boat launch pass for every successive launch. The original pass will be valid for the length of your stay. Please see the campground manager for availability.
- ✓ **Campsite Manipulation:** Site manipulation of any kind is not allowed without prior authorization by Bayfield County. This includes cutting standing trees (dead or alive) or shrubs, removing vegetation of any kind, placing permanent fixtures, nails, screws, etc. on trees, installing posts, fencing or other similar structures, and significant earth work.
- ✓ **Water:** There are multiple access points for drinking water throughout the campground. Please see the campground manager or host for locations.
- ✓ **Water Hoses:** There are no direct water hook-ups in the campground. You cannot leave water hoses attached to spigots. When you are done using the water, please roll up and remove your hoses.
- ✓ **Swimming:** Swimming is allowed at designated swimming areas only. Swimming is not allowed near boat launches, fishing piers or mooring docks. There are no lifeguards on duty within the campground. Swimming will be at your own risk. Diving or jumping off docks or ramps is also prohibited.
- ✓ **Electrical Use and Power Cords:** Electrical hook-ups are available for in-site use only. Electrical cords running from campsites to unauthorized areas shall be removed if the safety of other campground users is compromised. It is prohibited to run electrical cords from your campsite to the shoreline or to any place where the cord may come into contact with water. In addition, if using a power cord at your site, it must be placed in an area that is out of the way. The campground manager needs to access the site for maintenance (i.e., mowing and weed whipping). If power cords are creating a hazard, as determined by Bayfield County, the renter may be held responsible for site maintenance.
- ✓ **Garbage:** Pack out what you pack in. Please dispose of garbage and recycling in approved receptacles.
- ✓ **Fishing:** The campground offers excellent fishing opportunities. In addition to the extensive shoreline, there are numerous docks to fish from. When fishing from the boat launch dock, please allow adequate access for those who are launching their boats.
- ✓ **Fish Disposal:** Do not dispose of fish guts in dumpsters. This creates extremely foul odors and attracts bear. Contact campground manager or host for alternate disposal options.
- ✓ **Showers:** Hot showers are available within the campground. If camping at the campground, there are no additional fees for the use of the shower. If not camping, the fee will be \$1.00/use/person. Showers are first come, first served.
- ✓ **Power Tools and Generators:** Generators can only be used in cases of emergency or as otherwise approved by Bayfield County. The use of chainsaws or other loud power tools are not permitted unless specifically authorized by Bayfield County or the campground manager.

- ✓ **Wi-Fi:** High speed wireless internet is available within the campground. Access to the internet is included as part of your stay. Please see the campground manager for more information.
- ✓ **CHECK IN AND OUT TIMES:** Unless prior arrangements have been made with the campground manager, check-in is no earlier than 2:00 p.m. and check-out is no later than noon.

**FOR SEASONAL CAMPERS ONLY**

- ✓ Seasonal campers are responsible for keeping their sites free of clutter, so the campground manager can mow and weed whip the campsite. A seasonal camper may be responsible for the maintenance of their own site if there are too many obstacles or items to mow/whip around, as determined and directed by the campground manager.
- ✓ Seasonal campers are responsible for keeping their fire rings clean. If the County or campground manager must clean the fire rings, the seasonal camper will be charged accordingly.
- ✓ All rules and regulations described above, including noise and quiet hours, also apply to seasonal campers. Repeated violations may result in a termination of your seasonal campsite and your subsequent removal from the campground without refund.
  
- ✓ The Campground Manager is responsible for the enforcement of all Bayfield County campground policies described above and works directly with the Forestry and Parks Department. If there are any questions or concerns about these policies, or if clarification is needed, please consult directly with the Campground Manager (contact info above).
