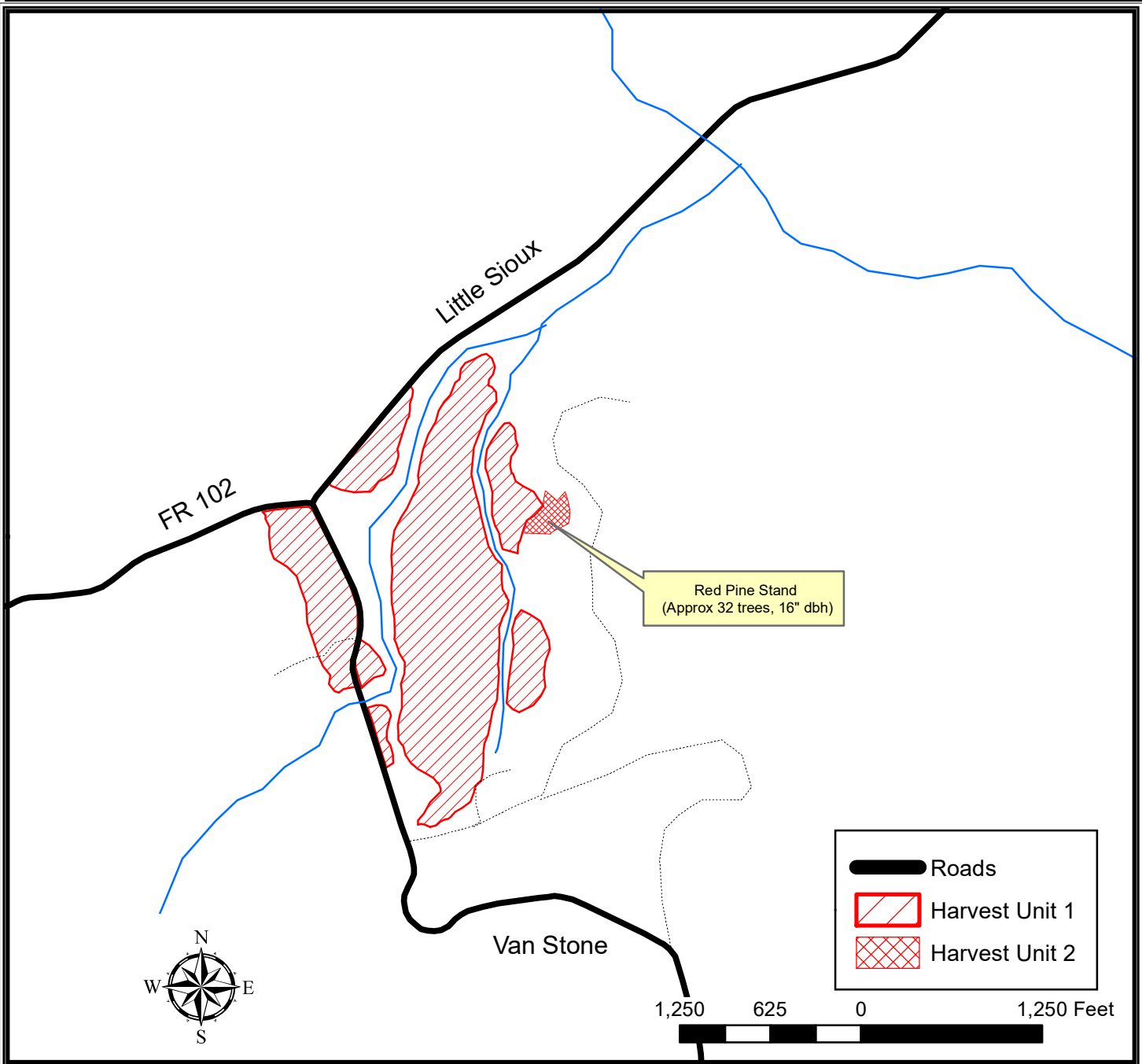

TRACT 26-23 – HARVEST REQUIREMENTS

The following terms and conditions supplement those provided in the Bayfield County Timber Sale Contract.

A. PRESCRIPTION:

1. Harvest unit 1 has a coppice harvest prescription with an estimated average residual basal area of 15 sq. ft.
2. Harvest Unit 2 has a thinning prescription with an estimated average residual basal area of 110 sq. ft.

B. HARVEST REQUIREMENTS:

1. Harvest unit 1: Harvest all hardwood 2" and greater. Harvest all white spruce and jack pine. Leave all fir, cedar, hemlock, red and white pine. Leave all purple painted trees.
2. Harvest Unit 2: Harvest all orange painted trees. Approx. 30-35 trees with an avg. diameter of 16".
3. To protect a sensitive terrestrial species during the nesting season **no harvesting will be allowed between May 20 – August 10.**
4. If harvest will utilize the whole tree, 1 in 10 tops must be left scattered throughout the sale.

C. ACCESS AND ROADS:

1. Access is off Van Stone and Little Sioux road.
2. Many of the harvest units are adjacent to drainages and small streams. No crossing of these excluded areas will be allowed. The middle unit access is from the southern trail. Same with the southeast unit. The east unit and pine stand will be access off the trail that comes in from the east.

D. OTHER:

1. Red paint line borders the entire timber sale.
2. To comply with Best Management Practices for Invasive Species: Prior to moving equipment onto or off the sale area, scrape or brush soil and debris from exterior surfaces to the extent practical.
3. Do not damage any survey monumentation.
