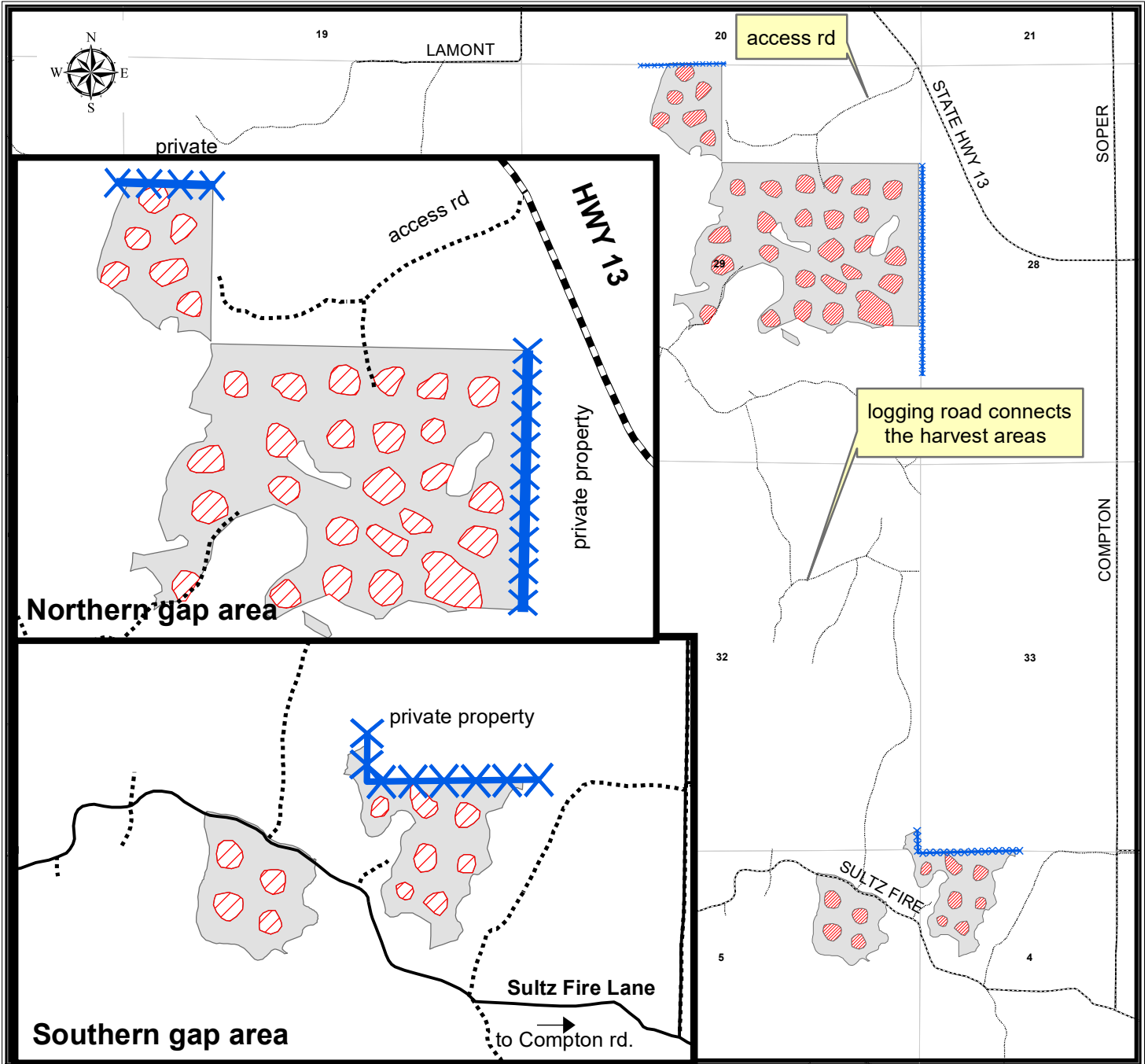

TRACT 30-23 – HARVEST REQUIREMENTS

The following terms and conditions supplement those provided in the Bayfield County Timber Sale Contract.

A. PRESCRIPTION:

1. Harvest unit 1 has a clearcut prescription in 42 (1-1.5 acre) gaps.

B. HARVEST REQUIREMENTS:

1. Harvest unit 1: harvest all hardwood 2" and greater, leave all conifer.
2. Gaps are painted out in purple paint.
3. 42 Gaps are located approx. 400 ft apart from gap center to gap center. No trees were marked in between the gaps.
4. Harvesting of some operational trees to access each gap with the logging equipment will be allowed. Operational trees, if needed, should be the smallest diameter trees possible to gain access to the gaps.
5. No sale operations allowed between breakup and July 15th to prevent bark peeling.
6. If harvest will utilize the whole tree, 1 in 10 tops must be left scattered throughout the sale.

C. ACCESS AND ROADS

1. Access to the northern portion of sale is off Hwy 13 as noted on the map. Access to the southern portion is off Sultz Fire lane off Compton road. There is a logging road that connects the two harvest areas as a possible route to haul the southern patches north to Hwy 13.

D. OTHER:

1. Private property exists adjacent to portions of this sale and is marked out with blue paint. No equipment or trees may cross the blue paint line.
2. Minimize damage to residual trees.
3. Crushing/cutting ironwood within gaps is encouraged.
4. To comply with Best Management Practices for Invasive Species: Prior to moving equipment onto or off the sale area, scrape or brush soil and debris from exterior surfaces to the extent practical.
5. Do not damage any survey monumentation.
